Blackheath lose to Cambridge University in a match at Hayes. The Cambridge winner is H B Stallard who will go on to win the bronze medal in the 1500 metres at the 1924 Olympics.

The Club also lose a match against Oxford University and a mob match against South London Harriers.

75 years ago in October 1947.

Blackheath beat South London Harriers in the Mob Match at Hayes.

They also win a match against Cambridge University with Jack Braughton, Sydney Wooderson and Gordon Monshall the first three home. Fourth is Chris Brasher of Cambridge.

50 years ago in October 1972

Scoring 49 a side Blackheath beat hosts South London Harriers in the Mob Match at Coulsdon.

Richard Coles wins the Youths race which takes place in conjunction with the Priory Relays at Reigate. In the relays the Club are 6th with a team of Bob Hawtin, Graham Botley, Chris Woodcock, Mick Hamlin, Ian Wilson and Bob Richardson. Pauline Wilson wins the £25 Monthly prize in the 200 Club draw.
