125 years ago in February 1898.

Sydney T Pyrke wins the Rowland Challenge Cup. Holder W G Suffield retires injured. Rowland is one of the judges. There are 2000 spectators at the Southern Cross Country Championships at Wembley Park. Blackheath Harriers finish in 10th place out ten teams. A junior race, by standard is won by Tee To Tum AC. It's not such a good day for Sydney Pyrke "Will the gentleman who in mistake took the wrong pair of running shoes from the Ambulance Room at Wembley Park on Saturday kindly communicate with S. T. Pyrke, High Street, Bromley".

100 years ago in February 1923.

Blackheath finish 12th in the Southern Cross Country Championships with A. C Telfer first home in 22nd. "After the race a capital function was held in conjunction with our Ranelagh friends at the Old Ship Hotel where 35 Ranelagh members and 30 Heathens sat down to dinner....An inpromptu concert followed... One of the principal events of the evening was the boxing up of the SLH Hon Sec E J Holt in a cupboard which had been laid on the floor. We hope he got out all right eventually... The festivities were adjourned about nine o clock, when a select band marched behind the Daily Mail Stentophone van with music playing; this resulted in a final war dance round the van, to the delight and surprise of the natives.

A C Telfer wins the Rowland Challenge Cup which has a field of 22 runners. It is the first race for the trophy since the death of Rowland in 1922. Below some words on Rowland from the Club History.

One hears much of the Smiths and the Reeds in the Peckham era. We must not forget that there were all the time a good number of other participants in this venture. Of these none is more worth our notice than the same Walter Rowland, one of the earliest to combine with the original trio, and a constantly interested member down to his death in 1922. Characteristically he first appears as "umpire" of an early morning mile race in July, 1870, and in his record of continuous service to the Club he typifies those hundreds of often unrecognized members whose contribution is sometimes intangible but no less vital for that. It was said of him in 1918 that he never missed an annual general meeting and rarely any Club dance or other social function, while he inaugurated the "Bohemian Concerts" that were popular for so long. When others failed to turn up in the early days he was usually there beside Reed. Then or later when delicate or unpleasant matters had to be handled he was often asked to chair the meeting. Indeed, he himself was twice to be embarrassed in the first ten years of the next century by having a rival candidate for the Presidency proposed against him, only the generous and dignified way in which he conducted himself on these occasions retrieving the situation. From his youth he could hardly have been of ideal athletic build and in the competitions he was often left behind, though his persistence sometimes won him unexpected success. He was certainly a "sticker" and twenty miles was not too much for him. Once when a visiting runner, Child, came down "a regular lump on his side" in trying to scale a high fence on a hare and hounds run, it was Rowland, together with another Peckham official, Felix Pridmore, who helped him home. And when the Committee decided in 1874 that it was time that a Club of their stature possessed a bath for the convenience of members and visitors, the cost not to exceed ten shillings and sixpence, it was Rowland who subsequently lent them one. It is difficult to demonstrate in words the importance of a key but unobtrusive member like Rowland - it must suffice to say that for nearly half of this history he must be thought of as present, supporting and guiding through all the crucial years. Perhaps the best memorial to the man is the Cup he presented

HIGH CARNIVAL. GAY SCENES AT BLACKHEATH. BLACKHEATH HARRIERS' REVELS.

Rarely can the Blackheath Concert Hall have held a more joyous crowd than that which assembled on Wednesday, when the Blackheath Harriers held a carnival dance. There was an attendance of more than 400, and fancy dresses were the rule. The multicoloured garb of the dancers, coupled with the streamers and the huge clusters of balloons which hung from the roof, made a bright and charming scene. As to the characters: it would almost be easier to give a list of those not represented than to enumerate those which were seen. From Mephistopheles to the Good Fairy; from snow maidens to belles of the South Seas; from the gaily attired beau of centuries ago to the ultra-modern flapper; all were there. When the grand parade took place the effect of the long procession of bizarre, graceful, and intriguing costumes was little short of bewildering, and the task of the judges was not one that would incline anyone to envy. Amongst the "stunts" of the evening was the unwrapping of "Tut-ankh-Amen" (supposed to be

the original mummy—the "originality" can certainly be vouched for). As a matter of fact, when the wrappings had been removed there was exposed a very vigorous "beaver," with a face-fringe of the most

fiery red.

The proceedings were thoroughly enjoyable, and testified eloquently to the thoroughness with which the entertainments section had organised the carnival.

75 years ago in February 1948.

Sydney Wooderson wins the Southern Cross Country title at Aylesford. Blackheath are second in the team race with Wooderson 1st, Choat 11th, Braughton 14th, Monshall 25th, Brent 29th and Spencer 33rd. They also win the Camden Cup for the first Kent team to finish all 12 runners.

Sydney Wooderson wins the Rowland Cup... "And so a great name is added to lend increased value to the most coveted of all Blackheath Cups. It was a fine field, a fine race and a worthy winner." Jack Braughton, who later in the year would represent Britain in the 5000 metres at the Olympics is 4th, one place behind Gordon Monshall, 5th scorer for England in the Cross Country International in 1947. Future London To Brighton winners Derek Reynolds and Lew Piper are 9th and 23rd respectively.

The 75th Annual Club Dinner takes place at the Bridge House Hotel..."Quite soon, the President had given us "H M The King," clouds of tobacco were rising, and each with the beverage of his taste to hand, waited for the toast, "The Club." E J Holt (Secretary of the Amateur Athletic Association) proposing spoke of his respect for the traditions of Blackheath Harriers". (There appears to be no mention of the cupboard incident 25 years earlier)..." When Mr Rye got a show of hands of those who could go back to the days when Blackheath ran from the Green Man at Blackheath we counted about fifteen...During the intervals between speeches we were entertained by Clay Thomas, Miss Eynes-Hill and Wilfred Hubbard, the latter a man with whom no one in his right mind would play cards" (often billed as "Wilfred Hubbard and his 52 Assistants").

50 years ago in February 1973

After winning the Rowland Challenge Cup in January, Bob Richardson is 6th in the Southern Cross Country Championships with the Club 6th out of 45 teams. Richard Coles is 9th in the Youths race.

At the National Veterans Championships at Perry Barr, Blackheath win the over 60s race with A Keepax (4th), R Smith (9th) and L Piper (18th). They are also runners up in the over 50s with F Dyter 13th, G Monshall 17th and W Lake 29th.

25 years ago in February 1998

Blackheath win three golds at the AAAs Indoor Championships in Birmingham. Julian Golding takes the 200 metres in a time of 20.46, the fastest in the World so far this year and breaks the stadium record of Olympic silver medallist Frankie Fredericks. Joe Mills wins the 1500 metres and Dave Taylor is equal first in the 3000 metres. For Bromley Ladies, Debbie Marti is second in the high jump and Liz Gibbens third in the triple jump.

Julian also wins the 200 at the BUPA Indoor Grand Prix in Birmingham defeating the favourite, American Jon Drummond. Julian finishes 4th in the 200 at the European Indoor Championships in Valencia, Spain. Debbie Marti is 9th in the high jump. Bromley Ladies' Julie Stacey is part of a GB team which competes in the Ekiden Relay which takes place at Yokohama, Japan. Blackheath also have three winners at the AAAs Indoor Under 20 Championships. Alloy Wilson takes the 400 in 47.84, Nick Thomas the triple jump in 15.20, and Emeka Udechuku the shot in 17.02. Darren Watson wins the U15 Boys 60 metres in 7.50. As a result of their victories Wilson, Thomas and Udechuku represent Great Britain in an under 20 International against France and Germany in Birmingham.

Blackheath's Under 17 Men's team of John Baker, David Baker, Daniel Moore and Dan Ayrton finish runners up in the National Cross Country Relays. (The Baker twins both run 8.19, something the race computer can't cope with). Bill Foster wins the Sleaford Half Marathon in 67.30.

Mark Watling is first in the Club 10 to win the Rowland Challenge Cup from Roy Smith with Steve Cooper third. (25 years on in 2023 Steve is runner up. Steve Pairman also improves from 16th to 8th and Chris Pike from 19th to 10th.)

It is a very sad month for Blackheath with the passing of Roy Parris. Roy had joined the Club eight years earlier to raise monies for cancer charities by running marathons following the death of his son from the illness. Cruelly he too succumbed to the condition. He is remembered to this day with the annual Parris Handicap.
