150 years ago in April 1874

Peckham Amateur Athletic Club hold their second Spring meeting at Surrey Cricket Ground, Kennington Oval. "The somewhat bare and uncomfortable-looking Kennington Oval was never seen to better advantage, and the presence of numerous ladies added no little charm to the scene."

Events are open mile and 100 yard races; Members handicap races over 220 yards, 880 yards and two miles; and 440 yards Members Challenge Cup which is won by A Powles.

"The band of the 10th Surrey Rifles...played a nice selection of music...The prizes were afterwards presented on the ground by Mrs H Ecroyd and consisted of silver cups and silver and bronze club medals for second and third." The meeting made a profit of £3 14s 2d.

125 years ago in April 1899.

The Annual Dinner is held at the Hotel Cecil on Saturday 22nd April, "one of the cosiest and most successful of all the Thirty Annual Dinners held by the Club, was the unanimous verdict of everyone present"

A second Cinderella Dance was held at Headquarters on Primrose Day April 19th. "A good selection of up-to-date music was gone through"

The Easter Monday Athletic Meeting is held on the 3rd of April...." there certainly should have been a larger attendance – still it might have been a lot worse, in this respect, as nearly 3000 witnessed the afternoon's sport."

100 years ago in April 1924.

The 55th Annual Dinner takes place at the Stadium Club. "President Ponsford proposed the toast of "The Club" and delved deep into past history through which he sketched the progress of a great athletic body".

The third Sunday stroll takes place, but the weather is not good. It starts from the bus terminus at Farnborough. They walk in the direction of Green Street Green, "a typical Kentish village, all pubs and dissenting chapels...progress continued up hill and down dale to Chelsfield Station...the party pushed on to the "Five Bells" where light refreshments were forthcoming...the route was pursued along the lane to Eynsford, till a footpath was taken over the hill to Shoreham....a very nice lunch at the Old George...on over the hill to Halstead and thence to the Bull's Head, Pratt's Bottom, where Host King had a good tea ready."

75 years ago in April 1949.

Bill Lake wins the Johnson Bowl Seven Miles Walk.

Blackheath finish second team in the Wigmore Harriers 15 mile open road race. First home for the Club is Derek Reynolds in 6th place in a time of 1.30.42. They are also third in the Finchley Twenty Mile Road Race at Ruislip.

Blackheath are 11th in the "News Of The World" London To Brighton Relay. The race is won by Belgrave with Birchfield second and Tipton third. "In spite of our rather disappointing position in the race, everyone had a grand time and the journey home was a most cordial affair"

The track season arrives and the Club is third in a fixture against Milocarian AC and Metropolitan Police AC at Sandhurst. "An enjoyable match was brought to a satisfactory conclusion with tea on the lawn"

Only two new members are elected this month but there's a big one. Proposed by Sydney Wooderson and second by his brother Stanley, Anthony Pearson, better known to many as Tony Weeks Pearson, is elected to the Club.

50 years ago in April 1974

Blackheath finish in 8th place in the Southern 12 Stage Road Relay at Wimbledon Common. They therefore qualify for the National 12 stage at the end of the month at Sutton Coldfield.

In between these is something completely different, "The Pilgrim's Way Relay" a unique event devised by Chris Haines. On Easter Sunday, six runners in two groups of three run as closely as possible to the original Pilgrim's Way route from Winchester to Canterbury, bearing an Easter message from the Bishop Of Winchester to the Archbishop Of Canterbury.

Stage 9: A stunning performance from Brendan Foster, starting 6th nearly 2 minutes down on the leader and bringing Gateshead to within one second of the lead. His time of 24.28 was truly world-class (nearly half a minute faster than Black!) and threw the race wide open again—now less than 1½ minutes covered the first six teams. Further back the field was broken into other groups, but not sufficiently strung out for the order to continue changing. Chris Haines' time of 27.54 was quite respectable, yet he dropped four places to 21st, with Cambridge now back to 23rd.

Stage 10: Great excitement building up with Tipton showing in front again. After three and a half hours racing only seven minutes covered the first 20 teams, which included Blackheath as Chris Woodcock retrieved one place with 15.24.

Stage 11: For the first time Gateshead took a positive lead, David Lowes giving them a 19-second advantage over Tipton, with Edinburgh another 30 seconds adrift. The medals would surely be shared by these three teams, and presumably in this order with only one short stage remaining. John Baldwin gained one and lost one to stay 20th with 27.05.

Stage 12: A dramatic and thrilling climax as the Gateshead man not only blew the lead but any kind of medal. Tipton, Edinburgh and Cardiff all saved a fast man for this stage, and saw the gamble pay off, as they finished in that order. All the excitement was missed by Graham Botley, who was still only half way round the course trying to catch Belgrave's Lionel Mann. He did, but then lost him again, and ran 15.07 to bring the Club home 19th.

The unkindly weather apart this was the most enthralling National Relay for many years, and the overall standard was arguably the highest ever. In our last appearance in 1972, we finished 13th in 4.22.24, nine minutes behind the winners. This year our 19th place was achieved in 4.14.43, eight minutes behind the same winners Tipton. Saddest feature of the day was to see Bolton United, winners just a very few years ago, trailing the field.

THE PILGRIM'S WAY RELAY

On a cold and windy Easter Saturday evening five 'Heathens met as arranged at 20.15 on the Hogs Back outside Guildford and proceeded in a convoy of four cars to Winchester. A dormitory in a boys' boarding school afforded excellent accommodation to the team and their drivers, and for this we are grateful to the headmaster, J. F. Cornes, the 1500m. silver medallist at the 1932 Olympics. Before retiring for the night, the party sampled ale at a local hostelry, tasted the wares of a seafood salesman and listened (not always attentively) while Chris Woodcock planned and replanned with military precision the division of his group's effort.

The purpose of the exercise was this. Six runners, in two groups of three, would run as closely

as possible the original Pilgrim's Way route from Winchester to Canterbury, a distance of about 120 miles. The Way was reputedly established by pilgrims visiting the shrine of St. Thomas A'Becket, and can still be followed with only a few diversions. Each group of three runners would run in relay stages of arbitrary length (according to ease of access from footpaths and roads) and hand over the baton to the other group at intervals of approximately one hour.

Rising at 5 a.m. is certainly not everybody's cup of coffee, but somehow the team and supporters, including 9-year-old Andrew Baldwin, managed to breakfast and make their way to Winchester Cathedral for about 5.50, in good time for the 6 a.m. start. Astute readers will already be aware that only five of the six runners required were present at this point in time. The sixth, Ian Wilson, had been forced to withdraw at a late stage with a foct injury, and the reserve was Richard Coles, who at this moment was not aware of his involvement! He had been away camping in the New Forest for a few days, and was expected to turn up at an early hour as a supporter. It was therefor almost miraculous that at 5.59 a car screeched to a halt in the Cathedral Square and out fell Richard, still dazed from his 4 a.m. start and at first quite unbelieving of his inclusion in the team.

It was dry but bitterly cold as the group huddled around the West Door of the Cathedral waiting for the Greenwich time signal to set the team in motion. Only Mr. and Mrs. Haines, parents of Chris, were there to represent local interests, although a charming old lady who arrived an hour too early for the 7 a.m. communion service did show some concern. To add to the significance of this Easter Day run between two ancient cathedrals, the team also carried an Easter message from the Bishop of Winchester to the Archbishop of Canterbury, an idea of Chris Haines' who made the necessary arrangements.

The first four hours of the run were quite uneventful as the runners made their way through sleepy villages and along very quiet roads towards Farnham and Guildford. The only problem was a stiff easterly wind, which kept the temperature down in the low 40's. The first mishap occurred when Richard Coles, a geographer of no (?) repute, overshot a checkpoint, leaving Chris Woodcock in limbo and John Baldwin in a flap at the next changeover, St. Katharine's ferry in Guildford where the route crosses the River Wey. The first difficult country section then took the Baldwin Botley-Haines group via the picturesque route over the Downs to St. Martha's and the village of Shere and on through undefined 'paths' to the outskirts of Dorking. Here we met P.P. Roy Morley's touring party, about an hour later than planned because of the headwind and navigation problems.

The Coles-Horwood-Woodcock group then tackled another very tricky section from the slopes of Box Hill via Reigate Hill to the Caterham bypass. About halfway through one of the support cars sustained a split water hose, and although this was duly repaired the delay meant that Chric (I'm feeling good) Woodcock had to do a double stint. Further navigation problems added to the delay so that Caterham by-pass was reached at about the time we had planned to pass through Otford!

By one o'clock the sun was really warm and the wind subsided for a while without changing direction. John Baldwin and his party made the most of the delays and snatched an hour-and-a-half's sunbathing at Titsey church before both groups

set out on the long straight road sections through the lanes of Kent which still carry the name of the Pilgrim's Way. Club Hon. Sec. Ian Smith, in his capacity as official timekeeper, caught up with us at Otford station, and by this time the motorcade had extended to about nine cars and was presenting something of a traffic hazard.

Snodland, the Aylesford detour across the Medway, Hollingbourne and Charing all passed by, and now the spitefu' easterly wind was blowing hard again. All the runners were in good shape and good spirits — this was not a race but a very extended interval training session, and therefore to be enjoyed rather than suffered. Barry Shapcott was with us now, armed with cameras as usual, and Jack Sims found us at last, having tried to pick up the tracks all the way from Guildford. He was about to give up and return home, convinced that we were well ahead of him, when he located us some two hours behind schedule.

On through the chilly late afternoon to Chilham, with more valuable support from Chris Bird, and now only six miles out we are joined by Ian Wilson and Mike Peel in kit, and the latter's endlessly patient young children. In near darkness as eight o'clock approached, the full team of six plus friends and supporters joined forces on the outskirts of Canterbury and ran as a group over the last mile to the Cathedral. Our loyal helpers and supporters resisted the cold to cheer our arrival at 20.06.17 hours.

'he team then went to the Old Palace to deliver the message of goodwill from the Bishop of Winchester, and were honoured to meet and chat briefly with Dr. Ramsey. The Archbishop expressed his good wishes and appeared to 'understand' the nature of the event.

After photographs of the team and supporters in the Cathedral Yard, the hungry and thirsty 'Heathens set off in search of sustenance. It was

too late now too to think of showers and suchlike, so a Chinese restaurateur was prevailed upon to prepare food for our party of 15 or so, on the understanding that we would go away briefly and return in conventional clothing. The only changing facility at hand was a huge open-air car park, where we changed in near-freezing temperatures in the dark, save for Roger Michell, who hopped around with only one leg in his trousers in the blaze of six converging sets of headlights!

It was a very different and very enjoyable way of spending Easter Sunday; an excellent day's training for the team with no-one exerting themselves unduly, and a day made into something of a social occasion by all those who came along in whatever capacity, but especially the drivers, Monica Baldwin, Lesley Barrow, Roger Michell and Mike Woodcock.

As most members will know by now, Chris Haines does not promote these ventures just for their entertainment value. From the sale of programmes and a related competition to guess the time of arrival in Canterbury about £35 was raised and has been passed to the Treasurer. Prizewinners were:

Wigmore Ladies finish third in the Beta section of the Alpha Beta Meeting. There are wins for K Sawyer (100), J Ascott (100h) and the 4x100 quartet.

25 years ago in April 1999

Blackheath finish in 10th place in the National 12 Stage Road Relay at Sutton Park. They are the first Southern Club with a line up of Jeremy Bradley, Joe Mills, Giles Clifford, Martin Airey, Dave Taylor, Dave Heath, Roy Smith, Michael Skinner, Pat Calnan, Richard Daniels, Tim Dickinson and Liam Bulson.

Mark Steinle is 9th and third Briton in the Balmoral Road Races which are dominated by athletes from Kenya. He is also 5th in the Welwyn 5 mile road race in 23.21 and in the process defeats reigning National Cross Country champion Justin Pugsley; former National and London Marathon winner Eamonn Martin; and 1994 Commonwealth Games Marathon bronze medallist Mark Hudspith. Sixteen year old Gemma Viney is the first under 20 athlete to finish.

At the start of the month, at the City-Pier-City race at the Hague in the Netherlands, Spencer Newport runs the fastest time by a Briton over the half marathon so far this year, 63.43. He is the Club's first man home in the London Marathon with a time of 2.24.51. Colin Norris is first in the 11-12 year olds race in the Mini Marathon and Bromley's Ella Fisher wins the girls race. Mike Peel and Pete Shepheard continue their record of completing every London Marathon. Denis Lawrie manages to finish off ahead of a group of wombles. The Club's runners raise monies for two charities, the Royal National Lifeboat Institute and the Community House Appeal.

Also running in London is Steve Partridge who does so just a week after completing the Marathon Des Sables in the Sahara desert with George Payne. It's not 26.2 miles, it's 140 and run in temperatures of 58C over 6 days! Each runner has a ration

of 9.5 litres a day and carries a 10kg pack of safety equipment. London is a bit of a struggle and he knows he is in trouble when he is overtaken by an 8 man slug.

George Payne and I had decided to run the Marathon Des Sables 15 months previously during a Sunday morning run and had spent the last twelve, researching, co-ordinating and training. We had worked up to 40 miles a week, running a marathon or more every Sunday.

We arrived at Ouarzazarte and met a wall of heat as we left the plane. 3 days later we were at the start in the desert, having passed our medical and the regulations. We counted down from 10 to one in French and cheered as we crossed the start line. We ran, walked and hobbled over a crusty, sandy, lunar landscape with honey coloured dunes and the palest blue sky.

We had a road book that outlined the route over the terrain and we were able to take compass bearings, though the marks of several hundred feet did give us a clue as to the route.

We moved from bivouac site to bivouac site, staying in eight man Berber tents, which were mere black sacking stitched together, stretched over sticks and open at both ends. Their one luxury was a Berber carpet that lay between you and the desert. They were perfect. The day began at 6am with the Berbers demolishing the tents with us inside. The day was spent going from water point to water point and the evening was spent with conversation, cooking and examination of one's feet and other injuries. The night sky, brought out millions of stars, and both the milky way and the moon basked the desert in a silvery sheen, highlighting the ridges of the dunes and boulders.

Day one at 30 kms was the hardest in the race's 14 year history and we all felt that on reaching the end of the stage we, (the British contingent) were doubtful to complete the race, if the rest was like that. But we were getting accustomed, and day 2 at 32.5 kms though longer was easier. Day 3 at 37 kms, presented more sand, more hills and more stunning scenery.

We awoke on day 4 to find that a scorpion had spent

the night in our tent. It had been squashed by someone sleeping on it. We embarked on the 74 kilometre 2 day section and ran over a sea of dunes, anxious to get some miles under our belt and to complete the stage in one go.

We continued from day through to night, sometimes navigating by the stars until we came to the finish line. Completion of this stage was the hardest thing that physically any of us had done. Exhaustion and the need to see it completed, played a seesaw effect of stop and go on us as we walked the last section of the stage under the stars. Our feet hurt, Our heads hurt and we wanted to go to bed. It was 1am in the morning and we had been going for 16 hours in the desert sun and that was enough.

The next morning saw us take a day off and this was spent tending to our wounds and blisters. We found it hard to believe how our bodies could deteriorate so fast before our eyes. Each successive day we seemed to get worse or lose a bit more. Day 6 was the marathon day. This year the route went over the second largest dunes in Africa and we started over a range of these golden mountains 3000' high. We rose and fell through soft sand looking like the dunes of Morecambe Bay on steroids. It was like running the seven sisters marathon in an oven. A small caravan of six camels crossed our path nearing the end of its journey. After 12 miles the dunes came to an end and we ran across both a stony flat plain and lunar landscape to the next camp site. This for most of us was the effective finish, and the camp was ecstatic as we ate the last of our rations. The following day arose, and before us lay 9 kilometres to the finish. George and I ran together and we entered the town of Erfoud with another member of our tent. The last 200 metres were lined with towns people and government dignitaries. The camera crews were out in full and there was loud applause as we ran abreast across the finish line.

Even now it is difficult to describe how we feel. It was the best experience of our athletic lives and we are returning again in 2001, to do it again. If you get a chance, go; just go. It's magical. Blackheath win the Ostend Relays in Belgium, a 12 leg race of distances between 200 and 1200 metres, with a line up of Steve Holmes, Nigel Keogh, Paul Byfield, Mark Purser, Dave Gardiner, Simon Jones, Paul Fisher, Anthony Draper, Steve Cooper, Martyn Bucknall, Scott Jarred and Pat Squires. The veterans team of Colin Monks, Bob Minting, Pete Barlow, Ken Daniel, Steve Haley and Denis Wallington have to settle for second place, Denis being overtaken by the European Veterans 400 metre champion on the run in.

Blackheath's youngsters win the Parkinson Trophy Meeting at Haringey.

Dave Taylor wins the London Docklands Half Marathon in 67.07, and is second in the Croydon 10km in 30.08.

Bromley AC win their opening matches in both the Kent Womens League and the Southern Womens League. They are also third in the Beta Trophy Meeting.

While warm weather training in California, Julian Golding runs his second fastest ever time for the 200 metres, 20.20. The Club are in action in the Sward & Kinnaird Trophy Meetings to Kingston, and among those competing is pole vaulter Jim Day who first jumped in the event 41 years ago. The 65 year old finishes in 2nd place.
