

JULY - 1969

Half way through the summer season, with the results and performances of Blackheathens too numerous to give full details, even of our national representatives, a few notes must suffice. Most recently in the match against Czechoslovakia in Brno the British triple jump pair were our Tony Wadhams (first with 53ft.1in. the third best U.K. of all time and European qualifying distance) and Graham Hamlyn (3rd - 51ft.7 $\frac{3}{4}$ in), while back in June Bob Richardson ran a 28min. 36.0sec. 10,000 metres, 10th best in the world this season. In the Navy championships Peter Horwood ran 3min. 50sec for the 1500 metres while Bob Falconer in the Ryder Trophy did 3min.48.5sec. The most newsworthy information of our track team is the winning of the all field events Sward Trophy for the first time ever. Alan Domleo, running for Derbyshire, ran 1hr.43min. 42sec. in the inter-county 20 mile road race, to gain third place, and has since finished fourth in the Poly Marathon where Nick Mandeville, first Kent man, was eleventh. In the Welwyn Half Marathon Mike Willis broke 70 minutes. Our teams on the road have won the Margate "10" (Ian Wilson 2nd.) and the Chelmsford Half Marathon.

The County Championships at Crystal Palace saw a good number of Blackheathens, and our competitors did quite well, the climax of the meeting being the final event, the 5,000 metres, in which Geoff North (Belgrave) beat Bob Richardson after an interesting duel for most of the race between Bob and Richard Newble (Medway); Bob's time was 13min. 58.2sec. Our own evening meetings have been well attended, a pleasant change from recent years, but the special events to be held with Herne Hill Harriers at our third unfortunately fell through. For all other results, and reports, I must refer you to the next Gazette - remember to send them in reporters!

COMING TRACK EVENTS.

Our Centenary Track Meeting is almost upon us, and if you haven't yet offered your services please let Tony Nash (1, Spring Park Avenue, Shirley, Croydon, Surrey) know, we don't have to supply the top officials who will be A.A.A. Graded, but the many other jobs which are essential to the smooth running fall to us, we can put hurdles on the track more cheaply than the Crystal Palace authorities and this is an expensive meeting to put on: every programme sold cuts our cost, bring your friends as customers! We have good acceptances for the invitation events, we even have a Womens 300 metres for your delight. The first events start at 2.30p.m., the final relay at 4.30p.m.

The club committee have also agreed to supply the "supporting officials" for the National League fixture at the Crystal Palace on Saturday 23rd. August, although it is not absolutely clear at this time what is required of us; again please let Tony Nash know, directly, if you are able to assist, remembering that our "active" officials may well be competing in the Kent League at Erith on the same afternoon. The events at Erith will be 100m., 800m., 1500m., 3000m. S/Chase, 400m. hurdles, 4 x 100 relay, 2400m. walk, javelin, weight, discus, pole vault, high and triple jumps for the senior/junior age group, and also for the youth/boy age group except their S/Chase will be 1000m., their walk 1600m., and they will not have hurdles. In connection with the National League I am sure all members will be pleased to learn that the organisers have accepted the offer made on our behalf by the Centenary Management Committee to present a trophy for the league champions; plans are now going ahead to obtain a design and quotation.

COMING SPECIAL EVENTS.

The first of the Autumn round of events will be the Commemorative Run for which Norman Dudley has put in so much time, though he now finds he may well be in foreign parts at the time, which will be a shame, but the event will go on as he has planned it in as great detail as members have permitted. The idea is for a "pilgrimage" through various Blackheath "Countries", and also as publicity and a pre-winter get together; various routes have been selected so that runners of different standards will leave Peckham and arrive at Hayes together. Originally it was hoped to lay on transport to cover the various permutations of runs and rests, no one need run all the stages, but with the poor response last April and the impossibility of organising such a complex operation during the holiday chaos it is now up to members to make their own arrangements, it is certainly hoped however to lay on transport from Hayes to Peckham for changed

runners, but more of that later. Because of traffic conditions this will have to be a "run" not a race, and will have to be in packs of not more than 8 or 10, pack leaders will have maps, already prepared, and will it is hoped have had a dummy run over the course. It is hoped that members will bring their families with them, and then go on to the clubhouse for tea.

On the 18th October we have the Club "5", preceeded by the Club Photograph, and followed by the A.G.M.'s. On Sunday 26th the Peckham/Blackheath Stroll will take place over some of the earliest club courses at Peckham, little changed in many respects since last century! Those who have recently "pioneered" the old ways have been fascinated by their findings, so do make a note of this date.

A hectic month, but then in November we have the Club Dinner, the S.L.H. match and our Centenary Cross Country Fixture, which may well have a considerable international flavour.
